





<u>Names &amp; Numbers of Adult Teeth</u>	
Molars	1,2,3,14,15,16,17,18,19,30,31,32
Premolars	4,5,12,13,20,21,28,29
Canines	6,11,22,27
Incisors	7,8,9,10,23,24,25,26



## Important Notes:

\*We ONLY use the <u>Universal Tooth Numbering System</u> (Not ISO, Not Palmer) \*Do not use Black's Classification of Cavities (Class I-VI), Use Surfaces instead of Classes




Labial Surface is not typically used when charting. Instead, the term "Buccal" refers to teeth that are cheek side on posterior teeth, and "Facial" refers to teeth that are cheek side on <u>anterior teeth</u> for the Maxillary and Mandibular. Palatal surface Occlusal surface Proximal surface with contact area

<u>MIDLINE</u> – An imaginary line that separates the right side of the mouth from the left side of the mouth to help determine Mesial and Distal. The midline is between teeth #8 & #9 and #24 & #25 (*see picture above*). The surface(s) closest to the midline are <u>MESIAL</u>, and the surfaces furthest away from midline are <u>Distal</u> (*see picture above*).

### **Every Tooth Has 5 Surfaces**

- 1. Mesial
- 2. Distal
- 3. Lingual
- 4. Occlusal/Incisal Edge
- 5. Buccal/Facial



<u>TIP #1</u>

Occlusal and Incisal Edge Surfaces are used interchangeably depending on whether the tooth is an Anterior Tooth or a Posterior Tooth.

<u>Anterior Tooth</u> – Incisal Edge

#### Posterior Tooth – Occlusal Surface

Both are the "Biting Surfaces" of the tooth but the surface name depends on which tooth it is. (Anterior or Posterior)

TIP #2

Buccal and Facial Surfaces are used interchangeably depending on whether the tooth is an Anterior Tooth or a Posterior Tooth.

#### Anterior Tooth – Facial Surface

#### <u>Posterior Tooth</u> – Buccal Surface

Both are the "Front Surfaces" of the tooth but the surface name depends on which tooth it is. (Anterior or Posterior)
